


Braided Wire Crochet Bracelet Instructor: Rita Martin Level: Beginner. Skills Needed: None. Description: Lacy wire bracelet with beads. Students Need to Bring: Beading mat, wire cutters, needle nose pliers(smooth on interior, magnifier and light if you need them.

Spiral Herringbone Bracelet Instructor: Sonja Colt Level: All Levels Skills Needed: Must be adept at using a needle and thread, and understand the bead weaving standard terms Description: Not only will you learn (or re-learn) spiral herringbone, but also get instruction to make a HB tude. This class will make a bracelet, which you can embellish. Continue on making bangles or a lariat with the technique. Students Need to Bring: Beading mat, scissors. Do the Hubble

Level: Advanced Beginner

<u>Description:</u> Learn this new off-loom bead weaving stitch created by Melanie de Miguel. This class will be an opportunity to explore and learn the single Hubble stitch and double Hubble stitch. A technique class and not specifically a project. <u>Skill Level:</u> Prior off-loom weaving experience helpful - no specific stitch knowledge required.

<u>Students Need to Bring:</u> Beading thread (Fireline or Nano-fil, either 6 or 8 lb., One-G or KO - beader's preference) needles, bead mat or board, task light if needed, scissors - basic beading tools.

Basic Canes with Polymer Clay

Instructor: Bertha Adamson Level: Beginner

<u>Skills Needed:</u> Basic knowledge of polymer clay is helpful but not required. <u>Description:</u> Beautiful intricate polymer canes have one thing in common - they are made by combining simple canes into a more intricate pattern. This class will teach basic caines such as bullseye, stripes, jelly roll, etc. and you will be shown how these basic canes can be combined into something more complicated. Teaching the Skinner Blend is an essential part of the process. You will use your canes to make beads or as a final product.

<u>Students Need to Bring</u>: You are welcome to bring any of your own polymer clay tools, especially a pasta/clay machine, but it is not required.

The bracelet opens with a magnetic clasp and fits comfortably. You can stack them for a glamorous look or wear alone casually.

Easy Cubic Right Angle Weave (CRAW) Bracelet or Necklace

Students will have the option of adding a large Swarovski Faceted Rondelle as a focal, and will finish with a magnetic closure. <u>Students Need to Bring:</u> Bead mat, task light and extension cord if needed.

You will end up with a Beading Buddy to sit on your work table.

Full Oersian Chainmaille

Level: All levels

<u>Skills Needed:</u> Although this is not quite a beginning class it isn't much more difficult than the beginning Byzantine pattern.

<u>Description:</u> The full Persian CM pattern can be versatile as well as one of the easier patterns to do. The photo shows 3 different looks by changing the order of two colors but still using the same FP pattern. The rings we will be using are 1/4 in. ID, 18g anodized aluminum (saw cut) which I hope to order about 3 weeks before the Bead Sampler. If you want colors other than gold, black, and frost you should let me know what two colors you would like by then.

<u>Students Need to Bring:</u> Two pairs of pliers: flat nose pliers would be best but chain nose pliers would be OK, Magnifier (if needed), mat.

Bezeling Cabachons with Peyote Stitch

As a bonus, we will discuss how to finish with UltraSuede and brickstitch edging. A bail can be added to create a pendant. <u>Students Need to Bring:</u> Needle (size 10, 11 or 12) of choice, Fireline 6lb test or Toho 1G thread (or equivalent), scissors.

I will teach a polymer clay technique called mica shift, which produces a fascinating optical effect. I will also provide other items, such as cane slices, mica powders, inks, etc. to use to decorate your clay.

Look What I Made with Copper Tubing

<u>Instructor:</u> Moe Stevens <u>Level:</u> Beginner <u>Skills Needed:</u> Good listening skills. Put your name on your tools. <u>Description:</u> Students will learn about the properties of metals and a few simple techniques that can generate unique designs resulting in a finished copper bracelet/cuff. <u>Students Need to Bring:</u> Tools: metal bench block with cushion, tube cutter if you have one, metal file, metal shears, flush cutter, round nose pliers, chain nose pliers, sanding block, nylon or rawhide mallet, chasing hammer, texturing hammers, a metal bracelet mandrel (borrow one if you don't have one). Some students may share.
