Fordite

Have you ever heard of Fordite or Motor Agate? It has become an intriguing type of cabochon for me. It's some times hard to find and that which exists today is all that will ever be.

Years ago cars were spray painted and then baked to set the paint. The over spray called slag would build up on the floors, walls and rails that the cars moved on. Layers after layer, color after color would build up and would have to be removed to eliminate weight on the equipment.

Artistic minded workers thought to save this this attractive sludge and found that it could be cut, shaped and polished into items for jewelry making. If you have a chance to buy one of these pieces you you are buying a piece of history because cars are no longer painted in this manner. Cars are now electroplated so no Fordite is created. The burgundy piece is from a Ford factory and the other two are from a Nissan factory.

RMBS classes will continue to be a tremendous bargain compared to other venues where students are significantly upcharged by the conference or venue.
