DID YOU KNOW: POLYMER CLAY

Polymer clay is a popular medium for making jewelry, beads, charms, figurines, picture frames and other handmade creations. You can make just about anything you can dream up with polymer clay. You can easily turn any object into a one-of-a-kind gift with polymer clay!

- Polymer clay is a synthetic type of modeling clay. The primary ingredient is a polyvinyl chloride (PVC) base. Other
 ingredients like fillers, pigments and bendable plasticizers are added to create the finished product. These
 components work together to give polymer clay its flexibility, texture, softness and vibrant color. Polymer clay
 remains pliable until it's baked in the oven. The finished product is rigid and firm.
- 2. Polymer clay is non-toxic. Have you dreamt of decorating a coffee mug with little polymer clay pugs? Do you wish to cover a spoon handle in clay vines and butterflies? Have no fear you can go ahead and make that mug or spoon without worries. Polymer clay is non-toxic, so it is completely safe to use around children and pets.
- 3. it's safe to use the same oven or toaster oven you use to cook food to cure your clay as it does not give off toxic fumes. However, if baked at higher temperatures than recommended, polymer clay can give off fumes that may cause eye, nose or mouth irritation. In addition, avoid baking clay on surfaces you plan to use for food.
- 4. When you create something with polymer clay, you can expect it to stay the same size throughout the entire process. Polymer clay doesn't shrink or expand. Your fine details and intricate patterns will look the same coming out of the oven as they did going in. Your creations will stay true to scale so you can visualize the finished product before you cure the clay. And If polymer clay is baked correctly, it will stay the same color after it's cured.
- 5. It goes a long way! You only need a small amount of clay to explore your imagination and create something you'll love. You can make figurines, jewelry, beads, ornaments, charms, keychains, embellishments, mixed media pieces and many other creations with even small amounts of polymer clay.
