THE SAMPLER (6/1 AND 6/2)

Finally, please do not bring any finished UFO Challenge pieces to the Sampler as class sessions start promptly at 9:00 a.m. and the break between noon and 1:00 p.m. allows for instructors and students to grab some lunch.

#### **2024 CALENDAR CHANGES**

Caren Johannes has to postpone her wire wrapping workshops and trunk show from August to our meeting on September 7. More information on her two workshops for a Wire Wrapped Pendant and Wire Wrapped Earrings will be available at a later date.

JULY MEETING (7/12) AND NANCY CAIN WORKSHOPS (7/13 AND 7/14)

The meeting date for the July meeting is being moved to Friday evening, July 12, from 6:00-9:00 p.m. for a special Design Chat presentation by Nancy Cain prior to her two workshops on Saturday, July 13 (Affinity) and Sunday, July 14 (Santa Fe). NOTE: the Friday night meeting is a change in date and time from our originally scheduled meeting typically held on Saturday morning. There will be no Saturday morning meeting in July. Samples of Nancy's pieces will be available at the Sampler and additional information regarding the two workshops can be found on the Workshops page at the end of this newsletter. Registration for Nancy's classes will open June 9 and be open

through July 12. Class size is limited, so you will want to sign up as soon as registration opens so you don't miss these fabulous classes!

## AUGUST MEETING (8/3) – GENERAL MEETING, PLAYDATE: HERRINGBONE ROPES AND BEAD-IN

Following our regular meeting in August, we will have our second playdate for all members to learn the herringbone stitch in flat herringbone, tubular herringbone and tubular spiral herringbone. This will be instruction only – no kits or supplies will be provided. Also think of this as a stash buster. Members will need to bring their own supplies. For flat or tubular herringbone, you can use either size 8 or size 11 seed beads, in one or two colors. For tubular spiral herringbone, size 11 seed beads and delicas are recommended, either both in the same color or in two different colors. This combination of seed beads and delicas adds nice definition to the spiral. You will also need your typical beading tools – needles, thread (your preference), beading surface, scissors, lighting, magnification – whatever you typically use for beading. This is a free event, you don't need to sign up, and bring some of your stash! For those not wanting to participate in the playdate, we will also have a bead in.

## SEPTEMBER MEETING (9/7) – GENERAL MEETING AND WIRE WRAPPING WORKSHOPS WITH CAREN JOHANNES AND TRUNK SHOW

We will have a brief meeting on September 7, 2024, starting at 9:00 a.m. followed by a bead-in and wire wrapping workshops taught by Caren Johannes. More information regarding the workshops is forthcoming and registration will open in August. Caren will also have a mini trunk show with additional stones, wire and chains for purchase by members.

#### YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

While we have filled the roles of Social Media Coordinator and Raffle Coordinator, additional help is needed for the Raffle to be held in April 2025. If you think you can lend a hand in any of the following roles, please email raffle@rockybeads.org by May 30.



- MailerLite Administrator (most needed) We need someone who is willing to learn Mailer Lite to create and send emails about the raffle to our mailing list. The emails are set up in Mailer Lite ahead of time and get sent automatically, so this person can work on their own time. Member(s) in this role need to have good attention to detail and not be afraid of learning new computer apps.
- **Sponsor Liaison** (more volunteers in this position makes the work lighter!) In this role, you will email potential prize donors and ask if they will donate a prize. The wording for the email is provided so you won't need to write it, just send it, reply to their questions, and follow up with them to make sure we get all of the information we need. This work will be done June-Sept. 2024. It's super easy, you just need to be responsive to emails and willing to check your email daily.
- Advertising Researchers We need members who are willing to research (look around on the web!) to find places where we can advertise the raffle like other bead societies, other beading groups . . . these could be in person groups like via beading stores or meetups or virtual groups like Facebook groups. It could also be "influencers", like folks who make YouTube instruction videos, who might be willing to plug the raffle on their channels. And while they are getting more scarce, perhaps local bead or craft stores would be willing to hand out flyers about our raffle. Ideally, we would like 2-3 volunteers in this role. This job can be done on your own time but needs to be completed by Thanksgiving
- Advertising Execution The volunteer(s) in this role will follow through with the recommendations of the researchers by sending emails and posting on Facebook groups, etc. to promote the raffle. It won't be necessary to create the emails and posts, you will just need to send them. This can be done by 1-2 people. You may also need to deliver flyers to local bead stores to promote the raffle, if the store is willing. The work in this position will take place in early 2025. If you are good with email and have an ability to post to social media, this might be the role for you!

• **Prize Packers** – Volunteers in this role will prepare each prize for shipping, including verifying prize labels and ready for "Raffle Day." In this role, you need good organizational skills and an ability to verify details. This work will be done in April 2025.

#### **SATURDAY MORNING**

Class:	Beaded Outdoor Solar Hanging Light
Instructor:	Miqueleen Valdivia
Medium/Technique:	Bead Stringing
Description:	Participants will do basic bead stringing to attach strung beads to a glass lamp shade.
Skill Level	Basic
Prerequisites:	Helpful to know basic bead stringing but not mandatory.
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$30. Kit includes: solar light, glass light shade, 4 strands of beads 7" - 8" (6mm -10mm), 1.5" of size 6° seed beads, 4' beading wire. Findings: several crimp tubes & wire guardians, 1 zip tie and 1 key ring.
Student Should Bring:	Bead mat or dish, chain nose plier, wire cutter, crimper tool, bead stoppers, ruler or measuring tape.



Class:	Heart of Glass	
Instructor:	Rachel Hungary	
Medium/Technique:	Bead Embroidery	
Description:	Small in stature, but with color galore! Simple but satisfying bead embroidery pendant with embellished accents. If hearts aren't your 'thing', a square cabochon option is available.	
Skill Level	Basic	
Prerequisites:	Comfortable with needle and thread.	
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$25, includes 30mm Paint Skin Cab, seed beads in size 11 and 15, assorted beads for embellishments, ball chain, bail, beading foundation and backing.	
Student Should Bring:	Needles (size 11 or 12) and black thread.

Class: Wire Weaving Sampler – 1st Session

Instructor: **Debra Edell** 

Medium/Technique: Wire Weaving Skills

Description: A skills class using dead soft copper wire, students

will learn several wire weaving styles and leave with samples of their work for future cabochon wrapping projects. Samples taught on 2, 3, and if time allows, 5

base wires.

Skill Level All Prerequisites: None

Kit Materials and Cost: \$14, includes copper wire (dead soft, 20 gauge and 28

gauge), polishing cloth, guitar pick.

Student Should Bring: Tools supplied by teacher. Bring if you have: needle

nose pliers, nylon pliers, wire cutter. Optional:

Magnifying glasses and lighting.



#### Class: Cellini Spiral Earrings

Instructor: Carrie Tahquechi

Medium/Technique: Bead Weaving

Description: Use round Cellini spiral stitch to create a pair of

earrings that have great texture and motion. These light but sturdy earrings are created with Cellini stitch in the round, a great way to build texture and that lovely spiral. I have created a 3-d printed tool to assist you in holding and starting this stitch as you go around the spiral, making this MUCH EASIER than the ribbon version of this stitch we have done in the past. Choose from a variety of kit colors to create your earrings. Silver and gold shown, other colorways will be available as supplies arrive. This is an all levels bead weaving class. Come and learn a new way to

Cellini!

Skill Level All Prerequisites: None

Kit Materials and Cost: \$20, includes ear wires, bead caps, head pins, drop

beads, fringe beads, size 11 and 15 seed beads and a 3-D printed tool for you to take home and keep

creating.

Student Should Bring: Bead surface, light as needed, magnification if

needed, size 11 beading needles, thread of choice (I used fireline 6lb in black), a beading awl if you have one, sharp pointed scissors to cut thread. Pliers to open jump rings and make simple loops are helpful if you have them, the instructor will bring a few to share.

Class:	Playing with Triangles
Instructor:	Jane Albright
Medium/Technique:	Bead Weaving
Description:	In this class you will learn to make an open triangle and then add dimension. Students will be encouraged to personalize their project. Many samples will be provided to get the creative juices flowing!
Skill Level	Advanced
Prerequisites:	Circular peyote , understanding how to "step up."
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$25-\$30, includes a selection of colorways to choose from and the findings to complete the earrings.
Student Should Bring:	Basic beading kit, size 12 needles, Nymo D or other heavier thread, scissors, blunt nosed pliers helpful but not necessary, your patience, creativity and good will!



Class:	Decoupage for Beaders

Description:	Make components that can be used in beading using decoupage methods.	
Skill Level	All	The state of the s
Prerequisites:	Comfortable with scissors.	
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$25, includes four wooden bases, paper images, decoupage medium, crackle glaze, acrylic paint for antiquing, paint brushes.	
Student Should Bring:	Additional paper images, tissue paper, napkins (all optional).	

Class:	Wire Weaving Sampler – 2 <sup>nd</sup> Session
Instructor:	Debra Edell
Medium/Technique:	Wire Weaving Skills
Description:	A skills class using dead soft copper wire, students will learn several wire weaving styles and leave with samples of their work for future cabochon wrapping projects. Samples taught on 2, 3, and if time allows, 5 base wires.
Skill Level	All
Prerequisites:	None
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$14, includes copper wire (dead soft, 20 gauge and 28 gauge), polishing cloth, guitar pick.
Student Should Bring:	Tools supplied by teacher. Bring if you have: needle nose pliers, nylon pliers, wire cutter. Optional: Magnifying glasses and lighting.

Class:	Flutter Pendant or Pin
Instructor:	Carrie Tahquechi
Medium/Technique:	Bead Embroidery
Description:	Use bead embroidery backstitch to create a bright beautiful butterfly pendant or pin. This project uses primarily size 11 beads in several colors to create a an ombre effect on the wings. A custom 3-D printed frame creates a perfect outline for the butterfly wing shape, giving you a great finished edge to follow with your brick stitch edging. This quick all levels project is suitable for beginners or those with experience that want to build on their bead embroidery skills.
Skill Level	All
Prerequisites:	None
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$25, includes size 11 seed beads, round black beads for the body, size 15 seed beads, bead backing, microsuede backing, 3-D frame and findings for choice of necklace or pin.
Student Should Bring:	Bead surface, light as needed, magnification if needed, size 11 beading needles, black thread of choice (I used fireline 6lb in black), E6000 glue or a glue stick to hold backing in place while stitching. a beading awl if you have one, sharp pointed scissors to cut backing and thread. Pliers to open jump rings are helpful if you have them, the instructor will bring a few to share.

#### **SUNDAY MORNING**

Class: Polymer Clay Mica Shift

Instructor: Bertha Adamson

Medium/Technique: Polymer Clay

Description: Polymer clay comes in a variety of colors and

characteristics. Some varieties, metallic in particular, contain a significant amount of mica particles. Using the proper technique, these particles can be aligned so the clay will have shadows and highlights that produce a striking 3-D

effect on a 2-D surface. This class will teach this technique. You will use the results to make beads or

focals as a final product.

Skill Level All Prerequisites: None

Kit Materials and Cost: \$20, includes polymer clay, an acrylic roller, cutting

blade, work surface, and use of more advanced tools

like pasta machine, cutters, textures, etc.

Student Should Bring: A lamp, if needed. Students may bring any clay tools

they already own and the price of the kit will be

reduced accordingly.

Class: Feather Earrings

Instructor: Rita Caldwell
Medium/Technique: Bead Weaving

Description: Use simple flat peyote stitches with seed bead

embellishments to make a pair of earrings

resembling feathers. This technique can also be used

for fringe on other bead projects.

Skill Level Intermediate

Prerequisites: Knowledge of flat peyote.

Kit Materials and Cost: \$30, includes two different colors of size 11 seed

beads, size 15 seed beads, pair of earring wires, 2mm and 4mm crystal beads, pattern instructions.

Student Should Bring: Basic beading tools, including 4lb Fireline, scissors

and size 12 beading needles.

Class:	Loom Basics	
Instructor:	Pat Lucero	_
Medium/Technique:	Loom Weaving	
Description:	Learn all about your loom, how to set it up, warping and weaving, how to string it for a bracelet or hat band, finishing techniques. Class will be demonstrated on a Mirrix loom but any type loom will work. A bracelet pattern will be supplied. Bring several different colors of size 11 seed beads or delica beads. A kit will not be provided.	
Skill Level	All	
Prerequisites:	Must have a loom and bring it to class. The RMBS has received a donation of five looms and students will have the option to purchase one of these looms with proceeds going to the RMBS.	
Kit Materials and Cost:	No kit will be provided.	
Student Should Bring:	Loom, thread, seed beads or delica beads, scissors, needles, task light, glasses, a smile.	

Class:	Earring Extravaganza!!
Instructor:	Carrie Tahquechi
Medium/Technique:	Bead Embroidery
Description:	In this class, we will explore making bead embroidered earrings with photo image cabs. Each student will choose two sets of image cabs to create two pairs of earrings during class. This bead embroidery class is for all levels and will cover beaded backstitch and brick stitch edging as well as a cute picot to hang your ear wire from. Cabs for this class are all created by Carrie from paper images and thin wood. Come to class ready to have a good time. These earrings go together quickly and always make you smile! There will be a big box of many different images, sizes and shapes to choose from and kits will be available in several bead colors to accent the cabs.
Skill Level	All
Prerequisites:	None
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$25, includes supplies to make two pairs of earrings - seed beads 11 and 15, two pairs of cabs, bead backing, microsuede backing and findings for earrings.
Student Should Bring:	Bead surface, light as needed, magnification if needed, size 11 or 12 beading needles, black thread of choice (I used fireline 6lb in black), E6000 glue and a glue stick to hold backing in place while stitching, a beading awl if you have one, sharp pointed scissors to cut backing and thread. Pliers to open rings on ear wires are helpful if you have them, the instructor will bring a few to share.

#### **SUNDAY AFTERNOON**

Class:	Knotting a Mala Style Bead Necklace
Instructor:	Bertha Adamson
Medium/Technique:	Stringing and Knotting
Description:	The traditional Mala Necklace is a knotted strand long used for prayer and meditation, particularly by Buddhists, but also used in modern times by anyone interested in using counting for calming, meditative practices. This class teaches knotting and design to create a traditional mala or a necklace influenced by mala design, for yourself or someone you know.
Skill Level	All
Prerequisites:	None
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$15-\$25, depending on the beads chosen. The kit includes enough beads to make a traditional mala, a guru bead and/or tassel, cord/string, and needle.
Student Should Bring:	A lamp, if needed, and their preferred beading work surface, larger size.



Class:	Bezeled Pendant	
Instructor:	Rita Caldwell	
Medium/Technique:	Bead Embroidery	
Description:	In this class, you will learn how to do a simple bezel around an object. The bezel helps hold your cabochon/stone in place so you don't have to rely on glue. You will bezel around Czech glass flowers in your choice of blue or red using two different size seed beads, crystals and silver or copper feathers. This small pendant measures 1x1.5 inches and is a quick, easy project.	
Skill Level	All	
Prerequisites:	Knowledge of bead embroidery.	
Kit Materials and Cost:	\$35, includes 22mm hibiscus flower cabochon, 12mm hibiscus flower or 12mm glass cabochon, size 11 and 15 seed beads, three silver or bronze feather charms, small square of bead embroidery backing, small square of leather, silver or brass bail, pattern instructions for bezel and pictures of finished pendant.	· · · · · · · · · · · · · · · · · · ·
Student Should Bring:	E6000 glue, 4-6lb Fireline, size 12 beading needles, scissors.

Class: Tree of Life Pendant

Instructor: Pat Lucero
Medium/Technique: Wire Work

Description: Using wire and stone chips, make a pendant to

represent a season or your own personal style.

Skill Level Basic Prerequisites: None

Kit Materials and Cost: \$25.00, includes 20 ga. and 26 ga. wire, stone

chips.

Student Should Bring: Wire cutters, round nose pliers, chain nose pliers,

round object for template (approx. 2", medicine

bottle works), bead mat, glasses if needed.

Crimping pliers optional.



#### Class: Chenille Bracelet - learn two forms!

Instructor: Carrie Tahquechi Medium/Technique: Bead Weaving

Description: Chenille stitch is an incredibly versatile stitch. In

this class we will explore two ways to start and continue the chenille stitch to create a bracelet. In the photo you will see examples of two bracelets, both made with chenille stitch with different starting passes.. The top photo is a sturdy rope that has a subtle bend and great strength, good for a nice bracelet but also hanging a pendant with weight. The lower photo shows a much more flexible and bendable rope. This form is great for bracelets or to hang a pendant that has less weight or if you want a more flexible neckband. We will learn both ways to start, and then you will choose which you prefer, and use this to finish your bracelet. This is an all levels bead weaving class and a great stitch to learn to use to extend your bead weaving skills. Silver and black colorway

shown, other colors will be available.

Skill Level All
Prerequisites: None

Kit Materials and Cost: \$20, includes enough size 11 seed beads in two

colors to create up to an 8 inch bracelet, lobster

claw clasp and jump rings for finishing.

Student Should Bring: Bead surface, light as needed, magnification if

needed, size 11 beading needles, thread of choice (I used fireline 6lb in black), a beading awl if you have one, Sharp pointed scissors to cut thread. Pliers to open jump rings are helpful if you have them, the instructor will bring a few to share.



#### **WORKSHOPS**

#### **Affinity**

Create a long vintage style, 3-layered necklace of peyote stitch rope, chain, and stringing. The uniquely structured beaded ovals accent the fringe of minimalist bezeling around vintage 20mm clear crystal stones and the use of the beautifully textured Miyuki cotton pearls adds a vintage touch. Skill Level: Intermediate/Advanced.

Nancy will have four colorways from which members can choose.

#### Santa Fe

The southwest inspired Santa Fe necklace, while simple appearing, is more technically advanced with a rope variation called Cain's Chain. It is an asymmetrical, two-step, spiraling netting variation. Nancy has updated it and added a structural peyote three-tiered open pendant at the bottom. Firepolish beads grace the rope and add swing at the bottom of the pendant. Skill Level: Intermediate/Advanced.

Nancy has three colorways from which members can choose.
