FEBRUARY MEETING (2/1)

Welcome to 2025! We hope you had a wonderful holiday season and that 2025 is starting off to be a promising year. Our first meeting of the new year will be held on Saturday, February 1, at the Lowry Conference Center starting at 9:00 a.m. We will present and discuss the results of our Member Survey conducted in November as well as the announcement of our first mini-challenge of 2025. Challenge pieces will be displayed and judged at the May 3 meeting.

Following our regular meeting, we will have a bead in with an opportunity for members to work on their unique personalized name tags. Have you figured out a design for your name tag?

Name tags can be any size and from any medium. You can use polymer clay, shrink plastic, bead weaving, bead embroidery, wire weaving, alcohol inks, etc. Opportunities are endless and limited only by your own imagination. Some sample name tags to spur your creativity are included at the end of this newsletter.

Trunk Show - The trunk show needs a new leader. Pat Lucero has done a great job arranging the trunk show for the past three years and is ready to step aside.

Tracy Knight has been busy finalizing our schedule for 2025, exchanging emails with potential guest instructors, etc. If you have any suggestions for playdates (can be a quick and easy project, technique, something that can be taught or completed in a couple hours), please let Tracy know.

In addition to the return of our 2025 UFO Challenge, which will run from January 1, 2025 through October 31, 2025 (with winners announced at the November 2025 meeting), we will have three additional mini challenges throughout the year. Challenge 1 will be announced at our February meeting with completed pieces to be displayed and judged at our May meeting. Challenge 2 will be announced at the May meeting with pieces to be displayed and judged at our August meeting, with Challenge 3 announced in August and displayed and judged in November.

Additional events on the calendar include the Raffle in April, the Sampler in June, the De-Stash in July, the Trunk Show in October and the Holiday Luncheon in December. We will also have workshops with BDotArtsy, a mandala dot painting artist (still confirming for March or later in the year); Melody MacDuffee, a bead and wire artist, in May; and a Zoom workshop with Shona Bevan, a London based bead designer in August. The SIG will also continue to schedule workshops featuring polymer clay that RMBS members can register for at a membership rate. ROCKY MOUNTAIN JEWELRY ARTS RAFFLE - 4/5

All prizes and set up for the Rocky Mountain Jewelry Arts Raffle have been finalized! Thank you to Diane Kremer and Debra Edell for spearheading this project and for all the time and efforts volunteered by the Raffle Committee members in making this happen! A preview of the Raffle will be presented at future meetings with the Raffle going live the last week of March where members and the public will be able to purchase tickets for prizes. The drawing will occur live at our meeting on April 5. The prizes cover a wide range of mediums for crafting and artistry, as well as a few finished pieces; everyone should be able to find something of interest.

SAMPLER - 6/7 AND 6/8

The Sampler will be held June 7 and 8 and the call for instructors will open mid-March. The Sampler is a popular event where members teach members a project or technique. If you would like to teach a project or technique, put on your thinking cap, pull together information and watch for the call for instructors to open so you can submit your application at that time! We are planning to have four sessions, 9:00 a.m.-noon and 1:00-4:00 p.m. on both Saturday and Sunday, with a minimum of four to five classes during each session, depending on number of instructor applications submitted. You may teach a design, technique or pattern of another artist with the express permission of that artist. Instructors receive a stipend and may collect a kit fee from students. We are asking instructors to limit the price for the kits to a maximum of \$30 where possible. Your kit may be priced higher but please remember that this could limit members willing to sign up for your class as it could also limit their ability to take another class and pay for that kit as well. Applications can be submitted through April 15 after which instructors will be notified if their class has been accepted.

Registration will open for members to sign up for Sampler classes on May 1 and close on May 15, to allow instructors time to prepare student kits by the Sampler. All instructors and students are required to be current members of the RMBS.
