MAY MEETING (5/3) – 2025 CHALLENGE 1– SPRINGTIME - VOTING, MELODY MACDUFFEE PRESENTATION AND TRUNK SHOW

It's our first mini-challenge – SpringTime! Please bring your completed piece in a paper bag, box, something so that no one else will be able to see your piece until they are displayed for members to vote on their favorite piece. Please turn your pieces in to Tracy Knight prior to the start of the meeting. The piece receiving the most votes will win a special prize!

Melody MacDuffee, a bead and wire artist, will be making a presentation regarding her artistry and Soul of Somanya, a charitable organization cofounded in tandem by Melody and Arkuh Bernard Tettey of Somanya-Krobo, Ghana. Soul of Somanya works to provide living-wage employment in the field of handcrafting for young adults whose prospects in life are otherwise very grim. Jobs are scarce in Somanya, especially for young people with little education and no skills. Many are forced to migrate into the cities looking for work. There, with heartbreaking frequency, they end up living nightmare lives on the streets, victims of sexual exploitation and other kinds of violence. Their children often end up abandoned or orphaned. When you buy a product from Soul of Somanya, you provide a market for the goods that these talented young people create. This, in turn, allows the young artists to keep working at a steady living wage. Melody will also bring her trunk show. She'll have lots of beads, stones and cabs for use in her classes and other projects! Lots of other accessories also.

Due to the popularity of her workshops, Melody will be teaching her first workshop, the Bezeled Cab Chandelier Earrings, on Friday afternoon from 1:00-4:00 p.m. This workshop will also be taught on Sunday morning from 9:00 a.m.-Noon.

Following Melody's presentation, Melody's workshop on Saturday afternoon will be Good Luck Dolls & Sidekicks and Sunday afternoon will be her Southwest No Loom Earrings or Bracelet. See the Workshops section for more information on these workshops.

Elegant and sophisticated, the Serpentine motif creates a dramatically twisted jewellery set. Featuring large, lustrous pearls wrapped in a carefully curved frame this is a satisfying project to stretch your CRAW skills.

When suspended from a slim necklace this striking design makes the perfect classic pendant to wear anytime. Made with smaller beads, the scaled-down version makes stunning earrings that twist delightfully while you wear them.

This project is suitable for intermediate/advanced level beaders who have very strong CRAW skills.

Skill Level: Intermediate to advanced.

Prerequisites: Students should be very familiar CRAW.

Kits are mandatory and will be purchased from Shona closer to the class date.

Bonbon Necklace

Almost sweet enough to eat, the Bonbon necklace is fun to make and easy to wear. Two sizes of lightweight cotton pearls are captured with sleek right angle weave (RAW) bezels and linked together with peyote stitched rings to make a relaxed long necklace.

This project is suitable for all levels of beader who have experience of RAW and peyote stitch.

Skill Level: Intermediate

Kits are mandatory and will be ordered from Shona closer to the class date.

Member Class Fee: \$60 Non-Member Class Fee: \$90 Kit Fee: \$65

Registration is required and space is limited to 20 students.
